#### TRIPS TO STANTON MOOR AND DERWENT VALLEY MILLS WORLD HERITAGE SITE

09.00	Coaches from Buxton
10.00-12.00	Guided walking tour: overlooking both the Derwent and Wye Valleys, Stanton Moor is rich in archaeological remains, particularly from the Bronze Age. Its barrows, stone circles and standing stones are set in a landscape of gritstone moors, river valleys and limestone fields.

13.00-16.00	Visit to Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site, the birthplace of the modern factory system. A fascinating series of historic mill complexes, including Sir Richard Arkwright's showpiece, Masson Mill.

#### TRIP TO CRESWELL CRAGS AND BOLSOVER CASTLE, INCLUDING CBA'S 2012 AGM
