ARCHAEOLOGY OPEN DAYS

Northamptonshire County Council are sponsoring open days at the excavations currently in progress at Angel Street, Northampton, the site of the new County Hall.

Project Angel Archaeology Open Days Weds, 6 & Thurs, 7 August 2014

The archaeological excavation of the Project Angel site has been ongoing since January 2014 and will run to September. The work is being carried out by MOLA (Museum of London Archaeology) Northampton, which was formerly Northamptonshire Archaeology within the NCC.

The excavations have examined the medieval frontages on Fetter Street and St Johns Street frontages, as well as the backyards containing pits, wells and a malt-drying oven, with the associated deposits of pottery, animal bones and a range of other domestic finds.



The NCC would like to invite people to their Open Days, where you will be able to view a selection of archaeological finds and speak to site director, Jim Brown of

MOLA Northampton and local medieval pottery expert, Paul Blinkhorn.
